As the plants have grown we have started to learn about 'height' and 'length' and the children have been using lots of great comparative vocabulary such as 'shortest', 'tallest', 'longer'. Along with plants, we have started to think about what else grows and changes over time, which is really going to help next term when we begin to talk about transition to primary school.
